"What Floaties Your Boat?" RULES

- 1. Have fun! Be safe! There is no fee to participate.
- 2. A parent or guardian of each participant must fill out a registration form and sign a waiver of liability/hold harmless agreement, which will be given to you upon your arrival at the race.
- 3. Participants shall be 10 years of age or younger and must be strong swimmers.
- 4. Any inflatable may be used as long as it is not dangerous. You may bring a floatie from home or there will be a limited number for sale at the event. No motor of any kind is permitted.
- 5. Registration begins at 10:00 a.m. on race day. An inflation station will be available.
- 6. Awards will be made at the discretion of the race committee.
- 7. Racing will commence at 12:30 pm in brackets drawn at random. There will be a beach start and then participants must circle the buoy offshore (from the left or the right) and then return to the beach.
 - 7.1 Classes: If there are sufficient entries, participants may be divided into age or "floatie" type or size categories.
- 8. No water balloons or other litter may be thrown.
- 9. Awards ceremony will follow shortly after racing concludes.
- The rules may be changed at any time in the interest of safety, enjoyment or the race committee's whim, to enhance the enjoyment of the event.
